

Lesley to send word versions of applications


Scottish windfarm funding guidelines are in place online and could be used by the funding sub-committee.

Consideration that there might be a requirement for planning permission, in particular for the defibrillator that is to be placed in Kinneff.



Update as of the 29th Jan 2018




Cotbank of Hilton application in Catterline is being investigated further due to falling within the 'coastal zone'. Flooding could be an issue.

Cllr George Carr confirmed there have been very few rejections to the new incinerator from the residents in Torry who will benefit from the cheaper heating it will supply.


Clarity on exactly what can be recycled is needed with everyone encouraged to complete survey and pass on their comments.

Bristol recycling scheme is currently being rolled out across England and could be a consideration for Aberdeenshire.

Roads and Transport

Community Action Plan

UK government to fund Aberdeenshire Council to put out superfast broadband throughout. Starts in Aberdeen and works it way out. Information is available on Aberdeenshire Council website on the roll out. Roddy Mathison from the council could attend a meeting to discuss the planned roll out – ACTION Piet - Contact Roddy and invite to one of the upcoming Community Council meetings.

Grit bins are being looked upon far more favourably just now.

£1M removed from the budget for gritting the roads with the coverage not sufficient for this winter – this has caused an internal review within Aberdeenshire council. Villages are considered 'on their own' and where possible, the community can grit as necessary. Therefore applications for 'self help' equipment (such as grit bins and sprinkler barrows) and are being looked at favourably by Aberdeenshire Council. Contact Steven Archer at such for requests.
