Police Report

Overview

- The local policing priorities for Kincardine and Mearns include:
 - Tackling antisocial behavior, violence and disorder
 - Reducing road casualties
 - Preventing acquisitive crime



There has been a recent increase in shop break ins and opportunistic crimes in the area — Perpetrators have been caught who were from Peterhead.

Speed checks are currently being performed in the surrounding villages

Planning Applications

- Karen McWilliam (Aberdeenshire Council) Study been commissioned on passenger numbers from Portlethen, Stonehaven and Laurencekirk train stations with draft outcome due at end of June

As not an official government website, approval was not granted to the Jobcentre/Post Office Near Me Websites to be added to CKDCC website.

Studies are actually ongoing in regards to personnel numbers but this is a more detailed survey for passenger numbers and feedback.

Montrose railway line currently being upgraded as it is single track at the moment in preparation for increased train traffic that includes the Huntly – Montrose crossrail service



 Piers Blaxter (Aberdeenshire Council – LDP) – Two members required to attend LDP seminar 20th
 June at 10am St. Bridgets Hall, Stonehaven

Question was asked if the previous approved developments from the 2012 LDP might still be valid – this is currently being questioned within Aberdeenshire council.

Water supply (and treatments) is an issue for developers. Streetlights, speed signs and sewage works needed when certain number of houses are reached – it was questioned what impact is being considered for Aberdeenshire Council.

Chapelton facility – schools, shops, sewage – It was stated that this is where focus should be applied to complete this development.

Number of houses being development against growth in the area does not seem a right balance at the moment.

Concerns of the Charleston flyover which with four directions of heavy traffic arriving at traffic lights, congestion is expected. Should be a continuous slip road available when travelling from Altens to travel South on the A90.

Catterline Braes



- Awarded funding from St. Johns Hill wind farm fund to allow 3rd party installation of anchors
- Glasgow Caledonian University awarded grant of £540k to research Catterline's issues over the next four years.

Chairman thanks Piet on behalf of CKDCC for his work on the Braes as part of the CBAG group.

Scope of work feasibility study still required to be performed.
