

Roads and Transport

A92 to Stonehaven slip road still has the markings – question was asked if signage would assist with the layout rather than changing it. It was mentioned from Cllr George Carr that this will be brought up in an Aberdeenshire Council meeting in the near future as there has been a number of incidents that has occurred there.

Catterline Braes



- Tim Stephen (Kincardine & Mearns Area Manager) will visit Catterline on the 30th April and attend the CKDCC meeting.
- Rob Reglinski has written to the MSPs / MPs associated with the Catterline area, looking
 for their support to address our coastal defences. A number of encouraging responses
 have already been received, with site visits and meetings to be arranged.
- Joint community council approach to be explored with Johnshaven and Inverbervie having a similar need for coastal defences.

Inverbervie and Johnshaven have a number of erosion issues that needs to be resolved. Johnshaven Rockarmour has been very successful – this can be seen clearly where the Rockarmour stops in the village.

Meeting of the three community councils could be beneficial to help align everyone.

Any Other Business



Push for new members to join CKDCC

Next meeting Tuesday 30th April 2024

Possibility to consider uniting all local groups (CBAG, Harbour Trust, Community Church, Gala) as sub-committees to CKDCC. This would allow consolidation of meetings and Office Bearers along with insurance benefits.

School roles, catchments and after school clubs are all been reviewed by Aberdeenshire Council at the moment.

Aberdeenshire Council are looking at another £30M reduction in funding which was already unsustainable at it's previous level.
